# Report





IWAS World Championship Electric Wheelchair Hockey 4 – 11 August 2014, Munich, Germany

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#### 1. Introduction

The IWAS World Championship Electric Wheelchair Hockey (WC 2014) was held in Germany, Munich from 4 – 11 August 2014. Eight Electric Wheelchair Hockey (EWH) nations were allocated and have participated:

1. Germany (Winner WC 2010 + Host nation)

Netherlands (Winner EC2012 + Nr. 1 World Ranking List)
 Belgium (Runner-up EC2012 + Nr. 2 World Ranking List)

4. Australia (Top Ranked nation Oceania Region)

Finland (World Ranking List allocation)
 Italy (World Ranking List allocation)
 Denmark (World Ranking List allocation)
 Switzerland (World Ranking List allocation)

This World Cup has been an unforgettable event for both the athletes and all EWH friends. In total, the WC has been attended by 3,500 spectators. Further spectators using the official livestream have not been counted. IWAS EWH World Championships 2014 in Munich have achieved a remarkable presence in German TV, radio, newspapers and online media. The teams showed a professional performance and equipment. The matches were fast and played at an high level of performace both technically and tactically. Matches were very exciting both for players and for the audicence. The Netherlands regains the title of World Champion while Belgium confirms his growth conquering also in the World Championship the 2nd position. The final match was really tactical and mentally demanding for the teams on the field. The Bronze Match was most exciting with Finland against Denmark getting for the first time to the big stage of the four finalists. Finland won the Bronze Medal.

### 2. General Organisation

A big impact to the success of the event was ensured by the presenting partner Mercedes-Benz, by numerous further sponsors (please see section n.12) and by the city department of Munich of course. In spring 2013, the municipal council of Munich decided to not only support, but to officially host the WC. This meant an administrative and logistic support and above all a lack budget up to €230,000. Adding the fees of the participating nations and the donations of further federations, institutions, persons and enterprises, the OC collected a total budget of slightly less than €500,000, which has never been reached until now in an EWH competition.

Despite this big budget, every Euro was necessary to be able to pay the expensive sports hall as well as the high class accommodation. The main part of the work was done voluntarily, so it's definitely not wrong to evince that a tournament in this dimension would not have been possible without the help of about 100

volunteers. These were recruited and advised by the OC and worked many hours a day for example as delegation guides, in the shuttle service or mainly in the sports centre.

The opening ceremony on August 6, 2014 was a big highlight according to all spectators. The founder and head of the Munich Sports Theatre Ensemble, who directed this ceremony, worked with various artists ("Stix" dance with crutches, "USC Munich" wheelchair dance and "Linguado" Capoeira) and voluntary performers and created an imaginative, entertaining and engaging stage programme. Furthermore, the official WC song "Champion" was live performed by the rap group "BlackOut!". The opening match between the hosting team Germany and Belgium took place right after the opening ceremony. With this linked schedule the OC could attract a very big audience (about 1,500) and many sponsors/VIPs to the first match, which was very exciting (6:6) and the best publicity for this fascinating sport.

# 4. Accommodation & Transport

During the whole event (4-11 August 2014), all officials, delegates and the 8 qualified teams (Australia, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Italy, Switzerland and the Netherlands) stayed in the 4-star hotel Leonardo Royal. It's easily accessible via public transport services (underground) and motorways. The hotel and the olympic ice sports stadium are separated by a distance of 2 kilometres. Hence, the 250 official participants could easily oscillate between accommodation and sports venue by foot, by wheelchair or by using the organised shuttle service.

## 5. Sports Hall

The sports venue, where practice sessions as well as the competition and the opening/closing ceremonies were hold, was located in the world-famous Olympic Parc. In the ice sports stadium, actually the home of a Munich pro ice hockey club, a new floor has been laid for the WC to offer the athletes the best conditions they can get.

# 6. Competition Organisation

The match schedule was set up according the regulations and passed off smoothly. The equipment of the playing field was according the rules as well. A sufficient number of educated timekeepers, scorekeepers and match assistants were arranged by the OC. Also a match secretariat was available and on all match days a reporter for the matches was present, which intensified the positive atmosphere.

For the first time, as agreed during the Sport Assembly held in Finland at the end of EC2012, all the officials have been appointed directly by ICEWH. The International Committee, in agreement with IWAS, also appointed the Technical Delegate, Chief Jury Member, Chief Referee and Chief Classifier as well as their Assistants. All of them take part to daily chief meeting together with the Technical Delegate and her assistant. All chiefs and assistants took also part to the Technical Meetings with Team managers and coaches.

Classifiers course took place on 3rd and 4th August with 3 participants who got their licence. The education for Jury Members and Referees took place in the spare time between controls and regular daily meetings useful to evaluate the day and prepare the next one(s).

Referees have passed the theoretical and practical B-exam and got the certificate. One new Jury Member was educated and got his ICEWH Jury Certificate. Two classification panels controlled the players' eligibility of every athlete using the ICF impairments system and basing on IPC guidelines. Classification procedure is made up of 3 steps: 1. Written medical information before the competition, 2. Control before the event, 3. In competition observation.

#### 10. Points For Improvement

- Officials need more space in the schedule to meet and/or train (for positioning and movements of referees) before the start of the competition (schedule the arrival 1 day before to have time for educational meeting - as already planned for Classifiers course - or by scheduling 1 day break between controls and matches or before final day).
- Schedule regular official meeting between Referees and Jury Members or at least within the Chiefs
  of those groups, to make sure they really share the same point of view towards the game and the
  observation.
- Insert the theoretical exam about rules and signals for both Jury Members and Referees before the event starts
- Jury members and referees should practice the speed control system together and decide on responsibilities.

- Add a specific section about speed control to the match form in order to make it 100% official and to
  have the chance to track back who has been checked in the previous matches and avoid when
  possible to test always the same players.
- Be sure Officials have drinks and something to eat in the changing rooms without need to ask every time for that
- Improve the education of the people at the match table who has the task to check the class point calculator and fill the documents and reports.
- The number of jury members and the number of referees needs to be increased to a minimum of 10 for each section. The workload was way too high and too intensive for the officials. There was no backup in case of sickness or other circumstances.
- Meetings should never end later than 2200 hrs. The whole meeting schedule has to be looked upon to become more effective and less demanding for everyone.
- An electronic tool is advised to create the match schedule and the implementation of the officials. This was done by hand and took way too much time.
- Classification has to be finished before the first match to avoid inflicting the matches.

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
